'gospel benedictions'

Rev 1:5 Unto him that loved us. and washed us from our sins in his own blood.

Rev 1:6 And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

- The benedictions (prayerful desire for God's blessing) have a special warmth
- They also touch upon many great themes

benediction comfort

- · So many of the benedictions touch the heart
- Just like a parent may embrace a child as he or she leaves the house so the benedictions are an embrace to our hearts
- · We see many comforting words, such as grace, peace and love

benediction gospel

- The cause of this comfort is the gospel of Jesus Christ
- This comfort is based on the strength of the Triune God
- The language of the gospel and of sins forgiven runs through the benedictions

benediction glory

- · And finally the great heights of the glory of God are seen in the benediction. Here we see a sense of praise and worship.

'gospel heights'

Hab 3:17 Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines: the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls:

Hab 3:18 Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation.

Hab 3:19 The LORD God is my strength, and he will make my feet like hinds' feet, and he will make me to walk upon mine high places.

 How to rejoice in a day of trouble.

· It is as if he was saying 'although the worst might happen we will rejoice'

the low point

- Habakkuk trembles at his own prophecies against Judah
- · He goes on to describe a period of harvest failure
- · This failure in the economy of the land may be because of the invading army's destructive powers or because of neglect
- The failure of the figs, vines and olives are also symbolic. They usually speak of peace, prosperity and shelter. The failure of the harvest speaks of the loss of God's favour
- The same is seen with the harvest fields, the flocks and the herds

the high point

- The word "yet" introduces the surprising rejoicing of the godly man in a day of trouble.
- · This is not a foolish positive spirit. This is a joy based on the truth of God. Based on the saving gospel of Jesus Christ and the strength of God
- It even speaks of the godly man being like the surefooted hind (female deer) and rising to the heights. So the godly man can know great heights in times of trouble
