Otley Chapel, Suffolk was opened in the 1830s and was part of the old Suffolk and Norfolk Association of Strict Baptists. To the present day, it has served this ever-growing village and the surrounding area, remaining faithful at all times to the faith once given to the saints.

The property has been well-maintained inside and out, and has a spacious manse standing next door to the chapel. Sadly, in spite of constant efforts to reach the local residents by way of door-to-door visitation, distribution of leaflets and calendars, etc. the congregation today is sadly diminished and without a pastor.

Recently, a like-minded church in another part of the county has undertaken to come alongside and help ensure its continued testimony and witness. There are many churches like this up and down the country; their work is vital for the maintenance and advance of Gospel witness in rural areas.
